### PROJECT #19 INSTRUCTION SHEET

# HANGING QUILT TAPESTRY

#### **Materials:**

• 1 sheet ea. of Black Ink Thai Marbled Momi papers:

#TMP-2498 Tidal Wave

#TMP-2486 Tsunami

#TMP-2488 Firestorm

#TMP-2487 Earthquake

#TMP-2942 Forest

#TMP-2489 Mesa

• 1 sheet of Black Ink paper #TSM-2156 Thai Momi in Bronze (but use the backside for black) or for a smoother texture in black, try #TU-2065 Thai Unryu.

- 3 Yards of 1/2" metallic gold wired ribbon
- 1 Dowel, 12" long, 1/4" diameter
- 2 Beads for end caps of dowel
- Cellophane Tape
- Mod Podge
- Waxed Paper
- Gold spray paint or metallic wax finish

## **Equipment:**

- Scissors
- Ruler
- Books or weight


## **Instruction Steps:**

- 1) Slightly sharpen both ends of dowel, then paint or wax.
- 2) Cut papers: 7 strips 12" long x 4 1/4" wide and begin laying out the pattern, as shown in step 2, using the back side of the cut paper strips, using small pieces of tape to attach the seams together. Turn over when once taped.
- 3) Working on the front side of the papers, start gluing strips of ribbon on the horizontal seams.
- 4) Next, glue ribbon on the two long vertical seams, top to bottom. Lay piece on waxed paper, cover with another piece of waxed paper and weigh down, allowing to dry before next step.
- 5) Trim quilt strips evenly across top, then bottom. Lay out backing piece, lay quilt on top, facing up. Cut backing, leaving 1/2" on each side and on bottom. With Mod Podge or double faced tape, glue backing to the quilt.
- 6) Brush Mod Podge on all 3 edges (shown in step 5) of the excess backing, first folding in the sides over front of the quilt, then folding in the bottom. Repeat drying process using waxed paper and apply weight.
- 7) Cut 5 strips of ribbon 5" long for dowel tabs.

Fold each in half, making loop, spaced equally across top of quilt, and attach with glue.

- 8) Cut piece of ribbon long enough to wrap all the way around the top of the quilt, front and back. Using tacky glue, attach ribbon so all endings will be in the back, out of sight. Weight and dry.
- 9) When completely dry, slip dowel through the tab loops. Glue beads on the two ends of the dowel rod. For extra sparkle, try hanging some extra beads from the bottom of the quilt!
